Preserves

The minimum weight of preserves is to be 350g unless stated. Preserves should be presented with either a new twist top or a waxed disc with cellophane cover to achieve a seal. Jars and bottles should be labelled with the contents and the day, month and year of making.

Class 61. A jar of jelly – minimum weight 225g

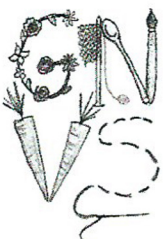
Class 62. A jar of fruit chutney, jam or marmalade

Class 63. Fruit liqueur – not more than 200ml

Class 64. A jar of pickles

- The Committee advises that some exhibits in the food categories may pose a risk to health if consumed following lengthy display. Please cover with foil or cling film where appropriate.
- For the purposes of this competition the competitor should be within the stated age ranges on Saturday 31st August 2021.
- The judges' decisions are final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- The judges reserve the right to withhold any award if they consider the exhibits to be of insufficient merit.
- The Committee cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to the property of any exhibitor at or in transit to or from the Show. No exhibits may be removed before 4.30 pm. All exhibits must be collected by 5.00pm.
- Property not reclaimed by this time may be disposed of.
- All trophies remain the property of the Village Show Society and must be cleaned and returned to the Show Secretary by 1st August 2022.
